Health Care Center Marks a Milestone

BROWNWOOD FACILITY IS ON TARGET TO OPEN IN 2020

The local health care landscape marked a major milestone Thursday. DPR Construction held a toppingoff ceremony to celebrate the completed structural framework of the Center for Advanced Healthcare at Brownwood and the Brownwood Hotel & Spa. Set to open in spring 2020, the 240,000-square-foot health care center will house a host of services under one roof. "This is a gamechanger for this community and this region," said Braulio Vicente, executive director of specialty services for The Villages Health. He described the project as a bedless hospital, meaning it will provide many services normally received in a hospital in an outpatient setting. The center represents a partnership between

established providers in the community, including Florida Cancer Specialists, Lake Medical Imaging, Lake Centre for Rehab and St. Luke's, said Dr. Elliot Sussman, TVH chairman.

The partner providers will offer oncology, ophthalmology and imaging services and an ambulatory surgery center, in addition to TVH's 13 specialties.

A Walgreens pharmacy will also be on site.

"What this represents for all the Villagers and their friends is more amazing health care resources for our very special and very deserving community," Sussman said.

Troy Purcell, practice administrator for Lake Medical Imaging, said he will be thrilled to see their sixth office open in the center.

"It will be our largest imaging center that we have

to date," he said. "We'll be able to provide state-of-the-art imaging for residents of The Villages."

In addition to other imaging services, the space will contain a 3T MRI scanner, which will allow the practice to participate in additional dementia studies, Purcell said.

Dr. Al Turri, director of audiology for TVH, said he looks forward to working with other specialists beyond patients' primary physicians to coordinate care.

"There are so many comorbidities associated with hearing loss," Turri said.

A team of educated providers translates to better, faster service for patients, he said.

Sussman said he didn't expect a project of this magnitude to come to fruition when he started at The Villages Health seven years ago.

"I dreamed, like everybody who comes to The Villages," he said. "It's a tremendously exciting day." The project hits close to home for DPR construction superintendent Daniel Vincent, who is originally from Lady Lake and now lives in Fruitland Park.

"This is a very prideful hometown project," he said.
